Northern Women In Ag





EFP's & Grant Opportunities

When you hear the term "environmental farm plan" what goes through your mind? Does it feel like a daunting task? Does it make you feel a little uneasy, worried there may be repercussions? Don't worry, it is a much more positive experience than you may think!

The Alberta Environmental Farm Plan **(EFP)** is a great tool for producers to utilize not only to identify what they are doing well on their farm, and what could use some tweaking, but also opens the doorway when applying for grants. Some grant applications require an up-to-date EFP when applying for funding (ie: RALP program, S-SCAP Efficient Grain Handling and Farm Technology programs). While working to grow environmental stewardship in the ag industry, producers will also reap the long term benefits of efficiency and increased profit while learning and making changes to build a better, healthier farm by protecting soil, water and air quality. These are key factors in sustainable crop and livestock production.

To apply, visit www.albertaefp.com and either renew an existing application, or start your new account. This is a whole-farm assessment tool that is completely voluntary. You will be assigned a trained EFP Technician to assist you in navigating the entire process, brainstorm strategies and make improvements. This self-assessment tool helps producers seek out their environmental risks unique to their farm, and develop plans to mitigate these risks. Fill out your online workbook on your own time and make updates along the way. Once approved, you will receive a Letter of Completion and signage. This looks great to the public, government and consumers.

Keep in mind that with land ownership, comes ownership of these environmental drawbacks as well.

OFCAF Program on Hold

As of May 10th the OFCAF program will be on pause. Intake is expected to resume in 2024.



The SCAP & RALP Programs are Open!

If you're still interested in applying for funding, the **Sustainable Canadian Agriculture Partnership** and **Resilient Agricultural Landscapes Program**s are open. These two programs are the successors of the CAP and Growing Forward Programs and will require an active EFP to receive funding.

Some of the activities funded are: Cross Fencing, Offsite Watering Systems, Converting cropland to perennial pasture, farm technology (soil sensors etc), and shelter belts.
