2023 Research Program Update

Where's The Beef?

For the first time in many years, Peace Country Beef & Forage has a Beef Project happening on the research farm! In collaboration with local producer Brock Friedel, we are proud to currently have 17 Cow-Calf pairs on the farm participating in a research project on Crop-Livestock Integration!



The cows were weighed the morning of arrival, and we are rotating them through 4 small pastures with the help of a Razer Grazer by Range Ward. Each pasture is blanketed in a beautiful cover crop by Covers & Co housing 15 different varieties.

The purpose behind this research project is to evaluate the benefits of integrating cows on grain production fields and to examine the improvement of soil composition, crop fertility and carbon sequestration through grazing and utilizing Green Manure and Cow Manure. Botanical composition of the soil was taken prior to the cattle entering the property. Pit fall traps were set in the cover crop that is being grazed, as well as in the cover crop that is destined to be put into Green Manure.

The cattle are also thoroughly enjoying 24/7 access to the Solar Water Buggy, leant to us from Clearfab Manufacturing of Cleardale, Alberta.

OFCAF Program on Hold

As of May 10th the OFCAF program will be on pause.

Intake is expected to resume on August 15th 2023.

The SCAP Program is Open!

If you're still interested in applying for funding this spring, the Sustainable Canadian Agriculture Partnership and Resilient Agricultural Landscapes Programs are open. These two programs are the successors of the CAP and Growing Forward Programs and will require an active EFP to receive funding.

Some of the activities funded are: Cross Fencing, Offsite Watering Systems, Converting Cropland to perennial pasture, Farm technology (soil sensors etc), and shelter belts.

Nitrate, Mold, and Mycotoxin tests can be added and will be invoiced at lab cost.
